Belnorth FC Referee Coordinator Report 2023

With over 50 Referees and Game Leaders, we had a terrific season as a refereeing cohort at Belnorth. With the dry weather giving us full winter and summer seasons, this was our biggest year ever, with over 1000 games refereed in the U8-U19s.


It has been a pleasure once again to look after our group of new and continuing Referees and Game Leaders. We had a great team spirit within the group, with everyone working together well and with great enthusiasm throughout both the winter and summer seasons.

Referee Numbers

In the winter season, we had 27 L4/L3 Referees and 31 Game Leaders. This was a significant increase on 2022 and the most referees we have had in my time refereeing at the club over the last 10 years. I thank the committee for their support in regularly promoting upcoming courses through the club newsletter and Facebook page, with the results seen in the significant number of new Referees and Game Leaders.

Of our referees/GLs, 25 were also playing for Belnorth across our U13-18 teams, with the U14D1 Girls team having the most with 7. Across the U16 and U18 teams, it was great to see a number of referees continuing from previous years and upgrading their qualifications. We also had referees who play for a variety of JNPL clubs, including Belconnen United, Tigers, Gungahlin, Canberra Croatia, Canberra United and Canberra Olympic, many of whom played for Belnorth as juniors.

We had several Game Leaders and Referees attend the Kanga Cup, getting invaluable experience and coaching over the week. We also had the opportunity to support a handful of Belconnen United JNPL

matches at Kaleen Enclosed. This was an excellent learning experience for the referees involved, and if there is the opportunity to do the same next season, Belnorth will be happy to provide support.

Next year, I hope to see our Game Leaders consider upgrading to Level 4, particularly those who have been a GL for a couple of years. Similarly, for our senior referees, there will be further opportunities for Level 3 courses and to get involved more in JNPL matches. We continue to have also had strong interest in upcoming courses, and the club will post these details in the newsletter when courses are announced in the new year.

Match Coverage

We had a significant increase in referee coverage compared to 2022. There were only two matches in winter without referees, both in the first round of the season. Overall, we had 525 matches refereed in winter, which accounts for 1332 referee appointments (including assistant GLs/referees).

For Henk's Summer Comp this year, we had 32 referees/GLs participate, an increase of 10 from last year. As with the winter season, coverage was very high, only having the occasional vacancy due to the high number of referees also playing and JNPL trials during the early weeks of the season.

With the significant increase in teams for Summer Comp this year, we had 53 to referee each week, meaning that close to 500 matches were covered over the 9 rounds.
